The pastor distributes the bread, followed by the communion assistants with the wine. White grape juice is available in the center ring of the individual cup tray; if you prefer the common cup, please wait until the first communion assistant passes. You are invited to partake as the assistant says, "The blood of Christ (shed for) you." The pastor will dismiss by side. Please exit in the same order as you came forward, placing individual cups in the basket as you return to your pew by the side aisle.

Let's remember the family of Jon Williams in prayer, as his brother recently went to be with the Lord. **PARTICIPATION IN THE LORD'S SUPPER:** Our Lord Jesus said "This is my body given for you" and "This is my blood, shed for the forgiveness of sins." Our confidence and confession of faith is that Christ is truly present and His body and blood are received along with the bread and the wine. Jesus' gift of Holy Communion is intended for believers who trust His words, repent of their sins, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that we may proclaim His death until he comes. Because this sacrament also unites us in *communion* with one another, those who eat and drink together are proclaiming a common confession of faith. If you have not been instructed in this faith (as taught in Luther's Small Catechism), have any doubt, or hold a confession differing from this and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, you are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to receiving. Children and adults who have not been instructed are still invited to come forward for a blessing, indicating so by crossing their arms over their chest.
