A Note from Our Pastor •

A famous monastery had fallen on hard times. Formerly its many buildings had been filled with young monks and its big church resounded with singing, but was now nearly deserted. A handful of old monks shuffled through the cloisters and praised and prayed with heavy hearts. Beyond the walls of this monastery, a Rabbi built a hut in the woods to pray and fast. Though no one spoke to him, the monks felt sustained by his prayerful presence, and the word would be passed when he appeared, "The rabbi walks in the woods."

open his heart to him. He was welcomed at the door with open arms. Inside was a plain wooden table with the scriptures open. They sat silently in the presence of the book until the rabbi began to cry, followed by the abbot. After the tears had ceased and all was quiet, the rabbi said,

One day, the abbot decided to visit the rabbi and

"You and your brothers are serving God with heavy hearts. You have come to ask a teaching of me. I will give you a teaching

but you can only repeat it once. After that, no one must say it aloud again."

Then the rabbi looked at the abbot and said, "The Messiah is among you." The abbot left without a word and without looking back.

The next morning he called his monks together and told them he had received a teaching from 'the rabbi who walks in the woods' and this was never to be spoken again. He said "The Rabbi said that one of us is the messiah."

The monks were startled by this teaching, but no one ever mentioned it again. As time went by, they began to treat each other with a very special reverence. Visitors were deeply touched by their lives.

People came from far and wide to be nourished by the prayer life of the monks, and young men asked about becoming part of this community. The rabbi no longer walked in the woods, but the monks who had taken his teaching to heart were still sustained by a prayerful presence.


This story, "The Gift of the Rabbi," (shared by Robert Strand in his book, <u>Moments for Pastors</u>. New Leaf Publishers ©1997) touches on a very simple, yet powerful lesson: The presence of Christ (*Messiah*) in our lives should make all the difference in the way we live and relate to others. When

the monks became disheartened by what had happened, they lost sight of their purpose as defined by Jesus himself: "As I have loved you, so you must love one another." (John 13:34). The rabbi's words redirected them to that purpose.

Another way you might consider this is with a question: "How many people are there in the world?" While you can use an online search engine or run the question through Artificial Intelligence (AI) to get an answer about the global popu-

lation, the simple yet more important answer is this—There are only two people in the world: You and Jesus. Do you see the face of Christ in every person you encounter? Do you realize that God has given you an opportunity to treat them with a very special reverence and to love them as He has loved you?

This lesson came clear to me several years ago, when Christine invited me to a workshop at Rochester Institute of Technology. The presenter shared a powerful training video created by Dan Cathy, President and CEO of Chick-fil-A. In less



than three minutes, "Every Life has a Story" gives a brief glimpse into the lives of 10 customers and employees. With no spoken words, a simple sen-

tence or two reveals the unspoken heartache or joy each person carries with them. Interaction

is an opportunity. Jesus himself reminded us that when we act in loving kindness toward others, whatever we do for them, we're doing for him.

The presence of the Messiah had an effect on the monks, changing their every interaction, and it made all the difference, not only for them but for those who watched them. Jesus told His disciples, "I am with you always." He didn't say "I am with

you *in spirit*" or "I'll always be in your heart;" no, Jesus said I-AM-WITH-YOU. We have known the loving presence of God in Jesus the Messiah. In the midst of our heartaches and joys, we gather in worship to interact with others and experience His forgiveness and celebrate God's promise of eternal life. Why? So we can share those same blessings in our interactions with others.

In this month where we're intentional about giving thanks. Thank God for our Good Shepherd and His gifts of forgiveness and salvation. Thank God for the challenge of seeing the face of Jesus in every person. And thank God for the privilege of making Him known in every personal interaction.



Luke 11:17-19 recounts the story of Jesus and the Ten Lepers. While familiar to many, perhaps we miss the significance of this lesson, which is often summarized as "Be Thankful" or "Give Thanks." Stewardhip—Gift of People by Kathy Mokris

Christian Stewardship continually teaches that we should be good stewards of the gifts given to us. We normally think of these gifts in three ways: 1) Our treasures (our money and stuff); 2) Our talents (our abilities and special skills); 3) Our time.

Recently, our Sunday epistle readings have been from Paul's letters to Timothy. Paul writes these letters to instruct and encourage Timothy to be a faithful pastor and to tell Timothy to pray for and care for his fellow Christians. In many of his other writings, Paul tells fellow believers how he's praying for them and how he's encouraged by their faith. He also wants to encourage them in their faith.

Based on Paul's writings, we can easily see that God has "gifted" us the church and He's "gifted" us one another, and that these Christian relationships are in fact "gifts" that we can steward. And our Lord Jesus says:

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. John 13:34-35

Some of the obvious ways we can love and encourage one another are:

- * Get to know other church members. Find out their names and their stories. Even if you've been at Good Shepherd for years, it's never too late to introduce yourself to the person who sits near you, and for you to encourage that person and be encouraged by him/her.
- * Pray for fellow church members and their needs. First, check the bulletin for those who need prayer. Second, as you talk to people and are aware of their needs, add them to your prayers.
- * Celebrate or just congratulate one another on life events: birthdays, graduations, births, weddings, etc.
- * Finally, imitate Paul and thank the Lord for those church members and other Christians who are an encouragement to you. Be like Paul and keep a list of those people, and add to it!

We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints. Colossians 1:3-4

Definitions—Fellowship by Perley Allen

We often hear the word 'fellowship' used in Christian circles, usually in the sense of get togethers, and activities where we can get to know fellow believers. We even have a Fellowship Committee here at Good Shepherd. In the general sense, fellowship expresses itself in friendship, in sharing and in caring for one another. Man is a social creature who needs and desires to be with others. For Christians though, fellowship goes beyond just friendship, activities and the such. There are biblical reasons for fellowship and even a biblical definition.

The Greek word for 'fellowship' is κοινωνία (koinonia) and is used 19 times in the New Testament. Our English Bibles use various words to translate this: 'communion' (which comes from the Latin for communis), 'participation' and 'sharing' are some examples, along with 'fellowship'. The Greek word κοινωνία points to what we have in common. Some examples are found in the following:

1 Corinthians 1:9 - God is faithful, by whom ye were called unto the **fellowship** of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Philippians 1:5 - I thank my God upon every remembrance of you . . . for your **fellowship** in the gospel from the first day until now. . . .

1 John 1:3 - That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our **fellowship** is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ.

In the above passages, fellowship speaks of a special sharing that we have, first with God, and then with other believers. An intimate friendship or union is seen here, but how are we to express that in our lives? With God, this fellowship or communion is realized in worship. Worship in our gathering together on the Lord's Day is definitely a major part of this, but it also involves a personal and active devotion on a daily basis. It is seen in our prayer and in our meditation upon God's Word. It is also evident in our words and behavior; a life of praise and thanksgiving, as well as sharing God's blessings with others. Fellowship with God is our daily walk with Him, of setting our minds on things above where Christ is seated (Colossians 3:1).

Fellowship with other Christians can be illustrated by a triangle: God is the point on the top, we and other Christians are represented in the lower points. What unites us laterally is our unity with God. Therefore, the center of Christian fellowship should be the worship of our God, and I might add, our participation in the Eucharist (AKA: The Lord's Supper). Note the words used by St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 10:16,17 - The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion (κοινωνία) of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion (κοινωνία) of the body of Christ? For we being many are one bread, and one body; for we are all partakers of that one bread. Some Bibles render 'communion' in these verses as 'sharing' or 'participation'; both further convey the character and depth of true fellowship.

True fellowship also has other implications, as we learn from Hebrews 10:24,25 - Let us stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near (NASB). Here the goal of our fellowship is the building up of one another in our faith, love and service unto our God.

Eat Wings, Raise Funds!




