Personal Prayer before Worship

Participation in the Lord's Supper

Our Lord Jesus said "This is my body given for you" and "This is my blood, shed for the forgiveness of sins." Our confidence and confession of faith is that Christ is truly present and His body and blood are received along with the bread and the wine. Jesus' gift of Holy Communion is intended for believers who trust His words, repent of their sins, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that we may proclaim His death until he comes. Because this sacrament also unites us in communion with one another, those who eat and drink together are proclaiming a common confession of faith. If you have not been instructed in this faith (as taught in Luther's Small Catechism), have any doubt, or hold a confession differing from this and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, you are asked to speak with the Pastor prior to receiving. Children and adults who have not been instructed are still invited to come forward for a blessing, indicating so by crossing their arms over their chest.

Romans 4:1–8, 13–17

¹What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? ²For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³For what does the Scripture say? “Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness.” ⁴Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. ⁵And to the one who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, ⁶just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

⁷“Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven,
and whose sins are covered;

⁸blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin.” . . .

¹³For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void.

¹⁵For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

¹⁶That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, ¹⁷as it is written, “I have made you the father of many nations”—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.




