

A Note from Our Pastor -

Have you ever discovered something new that had been right in front of you all along? If it didn't evoke an "I can't believe I never saw it before!" then perhaps it gave you a moment to appreciate the depth of something that had been hidden in plain sight.



As we begin Advent, a season anticipating the coming of Christ, a favorite hymn for many is "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." As far back as I can remember, I've enjoyed singing this Advent hymn, but I never knew that within it, something had been hidden in plain sight.

The Lutheran Hymnal (©1941-red/blue cover) included it as hymn #62, but with only 4 verses. Lutheran Book of Worship (©1978-green cover) added the 5th verse to hymn #34, then Lutheran Worship (© 1982-blue cover) included 7 verses in hymn #31. Our newest LCMS hymnal, Lutheran Service Book (© 2006-burgundy cover), not only includes it as hymn #357, but on the opposite page includes a piece of the story behind the song.

The Great "O" Antiphons are a series of responsive prayers, spoken in daily worship for 7 days (December 17-23) in preparation for Christmas. Based on Isaiah's prophecies, they reveal the different titles given to the Messiah:

- O <u>Sapientia</u> (O Wisdom) <u>Isaiah 11:2-3</u>; <u>28:29</u>
- 0 Adonai (0 Lord) Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse) Isaiah 1:1; 11:10
- O Clavis David (O Key of David) Isaiah 9:6; 22:22
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun) Isaiah 9:1
- O <u>Rex Gentium</u> (O King of the Nations) <u>Isaiah 9:5</u>; <u>2:4</u>
- O Emmanuel (O God With Us) Isaiah 7:14

The Great "O" Antiphons may be traced back to the 8th century. According to Professor Robert Greenburg of the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Benedictine monks arranged these antiphons with a definitive purpose—a secret code hidden within the Latin Titles of Christ. This code aims to heighten the expectation of Christ's coming, add a new depth and intensity to Advent worship, and bring worship to a joyful conclusion on Christmas Eve.

By the 12th or 13th century, the antiphons were paraphrased and set to music, which became the beloved hymn we know today. I imagine most of us have sung the corresponding verses, but haven't spoken the antiphons in worship...until now.

Join us for worship: Sunday mornings (Nov. 30, Dec. 7,14,21), Wednesday evenings (Dec. 3,10,17), and Christmas Eve (Dec. 24). In one of our services, you'll discover and decode this Christmas message hidden plain sight for nearly 13 centuries. Come worship and welcome the one whose coming was proclaimed by angels and shepherds, whose return we anticipate and whose titles we proclaim every time we sing "O Come, O Come Emmanuel"



MULTI-AGE SUNDAY SCHOOL: We have completed our Bible in Life series with these final lessons.

- 1. "The Cost Of Greatness"- James and John asked Jesus for special treatment. They wanted to rule with Jesus in places of honor at Jesus' right and left sides. Jesus told them "Whoever wants to become great among you, must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all." (Mark 10:43-44) Jesus calls us to serve others each day.
- 2. "Free To Forgive" Philemon had a runaway slave named Onesimus. He stole from his master and was in prison with Paul, who taught him about Jesus. Paul wrote to Philemon asking him to forgive Onesimus and welcome him as a fellow believer. As Christians, we are called to forgive those who have wronged us.
- 3. "Cooperation Or Conflict?" In John's letter to Gaius, he advises him to show hospitality to fellow believers as they passed through town. This was part of God's work. Diotrephes refused to welcome these traveling believers and was a hindrance to the work of God. We are to show hospitality to others.

The Parousia: The Return of Christ - 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17 and 5:1-4

4:15For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep. 16For the Lord Himself with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first, 17then we who are alive and remain, together with them, shall be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord.

5:1But concerning the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need that I should write to you. 2For you yourselves know perfectly that the Day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night. 3For when they say, Peace and safety! then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labor pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape. 4But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you as a thief.

Speculation concerning the Return of Christ has always been a hot topic among various Christian groups and even among non-believers. Paul points out that such speculation is foolish. It would be like trying to determine when a thief would break into your home. Far more practical would be preparedness rather than speculation. Of primary importance in Paul's teaching concerning the Return of Christ is that of giving comfort and encouragement to God's people. The apostle wants believers to know that the faithful departed will not miss out on the Resurrection simply because they have not lived to witness Christ's return. They have not been abandoned by the Lord. These teachings concerning Christ's return are also meant to renew and encourage us in our Christian faith.

In 4:15, Paul writes, "We who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep." The Greek word for 'coming' is $\pi\alpha\rho\sigma\sigma$ (par-oo-see-ah). This word has in view a physical presence and could also be translated as 'arrival', 'presence', 'coming' and 'advent'. It is more than just a casual appearance, for it denotes importance, such as a royal visit. The Parousia - "the coming of the Lord", will be a literal, physical return of Christ on the Last Day.

In 4:17, he goes on to say, "We who are alive and remain, together with them, shall be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air." This phrase 'caught up' is one word in the Greek, which literally means 'to snatch' or 'to seize', but it also means 'to steal' and 'to plunder'. It generally carries with it the idea of force and implies the element of suddenness so that there is no opportunity to resist. The example that I like to use is that of someone grabbing a small child who is about to run into the street in front of a car, thus saving the child's life. Our understanding of this phrase is important, since it points not to the secrecy of Christ's Return, but rather to its suddenness.

The reference to "The Day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night" in 5:2, does not infer a secret return or 'secret rapture' as some evangelicals believe. "A thief in the night" is better to be understood as also teaching the unexpectedness of Christ's Return, since a 'thief' will attempt to break in when not expected. Paul's overall teaching starting at 5:1 has to do with preparedness. Since that Day is unknown to us, our preparedness is based on living out our Faith by obedience to God's Holy Word and not on making predictions.

In Peter's final letter prior to his martyrdom, he uses language similar to that which Paul uses. In 2 Peter 3:10, we read, "But the Day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up." This passage clearly indicates that there is no 'seven-year period' between 'a secret rapture' and the final Day in which Christ returns and cleanses his creation of all unrighteousness. When Christ Returns the Consummation takes place.

SPEAKING THE TRUTH IN LOVE

And [Christ] gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ—from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love. - Ephesians 4:11-16

Apart from preaching a false gospel, the greatest destroyer of a local congregation stems from gossip and backbiting among members. Gossip can easily destroy lives, homes and jobs, as well as personal service and public ministry within the church. Gossip within a church is like a cancer - It will spread and cause suffering.

Interestingly, though some newer Bible translations may have the word 'gossip' in them, there is no one word in either the Old or New Testament that can rightly be translated as 'gossip'. The words that are used to describe gossip are varied and worth noting. Here are just a few of them:

Talebearer - (Hebrew - rakiyl), one who is a 'slander'; 'carry tales'; 'talebearer'.

Whisperer - (Hebrew - nirgan), one who secretly whispers malignant stories.

Babbler - (Greek adjective - σ περμολόγος), an 'idle babbler', but interestingly this word literally means 'a seed-picker', as what birds would do.

Backbiting, slanderer - (Greek - καταλαλιά), denotes malicious talk that tears down another's reputation.

Whisperer - (Greek -ψιθυριστής), a whisperer; a sneaky gossip; a backbiter.

Tattler - (Greek - φλύαρος), designates a person whose talk is empty, meddlesome, and injurious—an indiscriminate chatterer whose words lack edifying substance.

The remedy for gossip is speaking the truth in love, as described in the above passage. We must remember that if we have a complaint or problem with another brother or sister, malicious gossip is not the answer. We are obligated to go to that individual and seek reconciliation. In matters or sin, we are to follow the principle laid out by our Lord:

"Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.' And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector." - Matthew 18:15-17




