In accordance with our Constitution, Article 11, para B, the two Trustees on the council, and the president, have called for a special meeting of the Congregation. The sole purpose of this meeting will be for consideration of quotes for replacement of the HVAC unit #2 (the hallway near the restrooms), and voting on the recommendation of the Trustees. The Trustees received two quotes, one from our contracted maintenance provider Haller for \$27,070 and the other from Stambaugh Heating and Plumbing, for \$16,988 (which would require removal and reinstallation of the drop ceiling tiles & frames in the hallway by us).
